# **Human Trafficking Case Reporting Protocol**

Report: Mandatory Reporting of Investigations M.C.A. §97-3-54.1- Every investigation of a human trafficking offense shall be reported to the human trafficking coordinator by the initiating law enforcement agency pursuant to guidelines established by the coordinator.

#### **Guidelines for Reporting:**

- 1. For emergencies call 911.
- 2. Every investigation of a Human Trafficking offense shall be emailed to the Human Trafficking Coordinator at <a href="mailto:ReportHT@dps.ms.gov">ReportHT@dps.ms.gov</a>.

## If you are confronted with a "911 Emergency" requiring immediate armed police intervention:

Ex. You see a victim being chased by her trafficker or you get a tip from a victim being held at a specific address....

Call 911

# If you come into contact with a victim who is willing to make a police report <u>now</u>:

Ex. You get a tip or meet a victim in an emergency room... etc.

- Follow your agency's guidelines on contacting law enforcement on behalf of a victim.
- > Contact MBI at 601-987-1530 and ask to speak to a Human Trafficking agent. You will be directed to an investigator.
- Provide basic information that will help determine appropriate law enforcement referral:
  - Type of trafficking (sex or labor and child or adult victims)
  - Location (city, village, or town)
  - Phone number so an agent/ officer can call to discuss options.

# If you are working with a victim who is willing to talk to law enforcement:

Ex. You have a client who wants to make an appointment to talk to law enforcement, whether or not they are willing to testify. (They could be treated as either a victim/ witness or an informant)

- Follow your agency's guidelines on contacting law enforcement on behalf of a victim.
- If you are working with a non-U.S. citizen, consult an immigration attorney.
- > Call MBI Human Trafficking Unit at 601-987-1530 to arrange/ conduct an interview with a Special Agent.
- Do not leave details on voicemail.

# If you are working with a victim who refuses to speak to law enforcement at present, but is willing to pass along info (a "tip") about traffickers to law enforcement anonymously:

- Call the National Human Trafficking Resource Center's 24-Hour "Polaris" Hotline at 1-888-373-7888 or Mississippi Crime Stoppers at 1-888-8CRIMES (1-888-827-4637)
- Provide as much detailed information as possible about:
  - Type of trafficking (sex or labor and child or adult victims and the manner in which they operate)
  - Location (city, village, town, address, descriptions, signage and markings)
  - Offenders (names, ages, DOB's, descriptions, addresses, identifying marks)
  - Vehicles involved (plate #'s, makes, models, descriptions)
  - o Phone numbers (and phone company if you know), email addresses, social media, etc.
  - o Credit/Debit cards or Bank Accounts used, or other financial details

## **Informed Consent**

- > Be aware of your agency's confidential communications policy.
- If sharing victim-provided information with law enforcement will violate this policy, ask victim to sign a release form before contacting law enforcement.
- Release forms should:
  - o Explain the risks and benefits of reporting information
  - o Be available in a language the victim understands

## If the victim is a child (under the age of 18), please call Mississippi Centralized Intake (MCI) with MDCPS:

- Call MCI and make a report of a situation involving a child. (1-800-222-8000).
- When making a report of abuse or neglect, you may choose to remain anonymous as the reporter.
- MCI worker will staff the report with a supervisor who is on-call to determine the priority status of thereport.
