About the Position: This position is with the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics (MBN). An incumbent in this class performs skilled technical work involving in-depth investigations of matters of a criminal nature instituted by the Department of Public Safety (DPS) or upon the request of other law enforcement organizations. The incumbent assigns and coordinates the activities of subordinate investigators within the assigned district. The work involves the investigation of criminal and non-criminal cases, which includes interviewing witnesses, complainants, victims, and suspects. The incumbent is responsible for collecting and preserving evidence. Work is performed under the minimal supervision of an administrative superior.

The essential functions include, but are not limited to, the following: Serve as first-line supervisor at the discretion and direction of the District Commander or assigned. Initiate and handle cases involving criminal and non-criminal activities. Maintain liaison with other agencies, divisions, or departments of municipal, county, state, and federal governments. Perform related or similar duties as required or assigned. Please see "Attachment A" for more detailed information on duties for this position.

Minimum Requirements:

- High school graduate/Equivalent and Basic Law Enforcement Certification **and** successful completion of the Basic Narcotics Training **and** six (6) years of service w/ MS Department of Public Safety, five (5) of which must be with MS Bureau of Narcotics (MBN).
- **Selection Process includes:**
 1. Written Essay
 2. Board Interview
- **How to Apply:** Prospective candidates should submit a letter of interest via email to the Director of MBN through their proper chain of command no later than the listed closing date.
