

Sole Source Determination

Agency: Mississippi Forensic Laboratory (MSFL)

Proposed Sole Source Vendor: SNA International, LLC

Intended Contract Term: 3 Years

Anticipated Contract Amount: \$2,521,382.40

The personal or professional service offered in the contract is:

SNA International LLC provides staffing and enhances laboratory operations to build capacity and permanently reduce backlogs for government agencies.

The personal or professional service described above is the only one that can meet the needs of the agency because:

The Mississippi State Forensics Laboratory (MSFL) has had backlogs in Firearms and Drug testing that reached critical levels. SNA International, LLC, provides fully trained scientists in forensic disciplines that are capable of integration into the MSFL testing. Using the service of SNA International, LLC, has eliminated the drug test backlog and maintains sufficient turn-around-time (TAT) for our customers. While private laboratories offer outsourced testing services, the MSFL has determined that staffing and enhancing laboratory operations is the only reliable way to build capacity and permanently reduce the backlog.

The proposed sole source vendor is the only person or entity that can provide the required personal or professional service because:

SNA International stands out for its comprehensive expertise. SNA International offers the full suite of services required to support the MSFL, including toxicology, firearm analysis, tool mark identification, and chemistry-based forensic consultant services. In addition, SNA International is the only company certified by both CMMI and ISO specifically for the delivery and management of forensics, biometrics, and identity intelligence services. This dual certification demonstrates a commitment to maintaining quality in their service offerings and sets them apart from other vendors. Further, SNA's combination of historical knowledge of the MSFL standards and procedures; specialized certifications to ensure the delivery of quality forensics services; expertise with Justice Trax; experience supporting similar forensic operations; the number and type of SMEs to draw upon; and SNA's special screening and competency testing approach make SNA uniquely qualified to support this task.

Sole Source Determination

The Agency conducted the following market analysis in order to ensure that the service required was practicably available from only one source (any documentation relevant to the market analysis conducted should be attached to this determination):

The Mississippi Forensics Laboratory researched the market to identify the most suitable vendor for our forensic lab staffing project. Our research included analyzing the offerings, capabilities, and expertise of various service providers in the field. We also used a U.S. Government General Services Administration (GSA) schedule review to identify potential vendors. Through this evaluation, we discovered that SNA emerged as the only prime vendor capable of meeting our project requirements after conducting research for companies that provide services in the forensics area for lab staffing.

The amount to be expended for the personal or professional service is reasonable because:

Estimated Cost: \$2,521,382.40

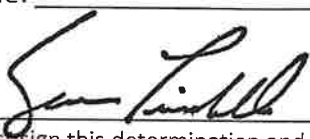
The services requested will maintain operations at the crime lab by providing five (5) forensic scientists trained in operations of the Mississippi Forensics Laboratory (MSFL). The MSFL saves time in the search, hire, and training of new or replacement forensic scientists to address our casework, specifically in our two largest disciplines: Firearms and Seized Drugs. The delivery of trained scientists by SNA has significantly impacted the MSFL operations and reduced the start-up time to results for the 5 forensic scientists provided. Additionally, consideration was given to the employee hours and costs required to package and ship the outsourced evidence to a contract laboratory.

The Agency conducted a noncompetitive negotiation with the proposed sole source vendor to obtain the best possible price on the personal or professional service by:

Negotiations were made with the vendor to address the funding required for the services. The quote was reviewed, MSFL rates reflect a discount from vendor GSA schedule rates and include 3% annual escalation in year 2 and 3.

Based on the foregoing, I have determined the intended vendor is the sole provider of the personal or professional services needed by the Agency. Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 27-104-7(2)(o) and (4) and Section 3-206 of the PPRB Rules and Regulations, the Agency intends to award this contract through a sole source procurement.

The Agency Head must sign this determination and cannot delegate that authority to other Agency personnel.

Instructions to File an Objection to this Sole Source Determination:

Any person or entity who objects to the determination that the proposed vendor is the sole provider of the personal or professional services described herein should file an objection with the Agency and the Public Procurement Review Board (PPRB).

The objection must provide a detailed explanation of why the personal or professional service provider is not a sole source; identify the Agency; identify the proposed Sole Source Vendor; state the RFIN Number for the sole source determination and the date that determination was first published (if available); and identify the objecting party to include valid contact information by which the objecting party can be immediately reached by the Agency or the PPRB (or its staff).

The Agency is required to publicize the sole source determination for 14 days, after which parties who object to that determination have 7 days to file their objections. Timely submission of the objection is the sole responsibility of the objecting party, and the objecting party bears all risk regarding delivery of the objection. Objections received after the deadline will not be considered by the Agency or the PPRB.

Once an objection to the sole source determination is filed, the Agency may withdraw the sole source determination and competitively procure the service or appeal the objection to the PPRB. The Agency will have the burden to prove the proposed vendor is a sole source provider of the personal or professional services needed by the Agency. If the PPRB has any reasonable doubt as to whether the personal or professional service can only be provided by one source, then the Agency must competitively procure the service.
